Quick Guide: Form 7004 - Business Tax Extension

What is Form 7004?

Form 7004 is used to request an automatic 6-month extension of time to file business tax returns.

Who Should File Form 7004?

- S Corporations (Form 1120-S)
- Partnerships (Form 1065)
- C Corporations (Form 1120)
- LLCs taxed as corporations or partnerships

Important Deadlines

- S Corporations & Partnerships: Due March 15 (extends to September 15)
- C Corporations: Due April 15 (extends to October 15)

Key Points to Remember

- This is an extension of time to FILE, not to PAY
- Any taxes owed must still be paid by the original due date
- S Corporations and Partnerships are flow-through entities but still need to file on time
- \bullet Late filing penalties: \$210 per month per partner/shareholder (up to 12 months)

How to Complete Form 7004

Part I: Automatic Extension

Check the appropriate box for your business type.

Line 1

Enter the form code for the return you're extending: - Form 1120-S (S Corporation): Code 25 - Form 1065 (Partnership): Code 09 - Form 1120 (C Corporation): Code 12

Lines 2-4

Complete if applicable to your business.

Line 5a

Enter the calendar or tax year information.

Line 6

Enter your tentative total tax (for C Corporations).

Line 7

Enter total payments and credits already made.

Line 8

Calculate balance due (Line 6 minus Line 7). Pay this amount by the original due date to avoid penalties and interest.

Filing Methods

- E-file through tax software or a tax professional
- Mail paper form to the appropriate IRS address
